Subject:-Grant of 3rd Renewal of Permission to Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan College of Ayurveda, Hospital & Research Centre, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, NH-12, Hoshangabad Road, Jathedi, Bhopal-26, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0628) with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

1) Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely to Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan College of Ayurveda, Hospital & Research Centre, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, NH-12, Hoshangabad Road, Jathedi, Bhopal-26, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0628), inspection of your College was conducted on 06.03.2024 and 07.03.2024 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the 3rd Renewal Permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25, under Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.

Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcoming/defect have been observed:-

1. Teaching staffs:-

a) Availability of total teaching staff for issuance of 3^{rd} renewal of permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course after deducting on paper teacher is $\frac{Available}{Required} \times 100\% = \frac{22}{25} \times 100\% = 88\%$ (Excluding Excess, visitor observation report) which is not fulfilling the criteria as per Sub Regulation (1) (a) of Regulation 8 and Schedule-V of MSR 2016.

2. Non-teaching staff: -

a) Availability of Non-Teaching staff is $\frac{Available}{Required} \times 100\% = \frac{21}{23} \times 100\% = 91.3\%$.

3. Hospital staffs:-

a) Availability of hospital staff is $\frac{Available}{Required} \times 100\% = \frac{65}{70} \times 100\% = 92.8\%$.

4. Functionality of the hospital:-

- a) There were 00 deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2023 to 31st Dec 2023. Labour room is not functional.
- 3) Thereafter, in accordance with section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act 2020, regulation 3(1)(f) of RMS, 2016 as per the letter of MARBISM vide letter no 26-75/2021-visitation dated 31/8/2021 and letter no. 3/2022/MARB/General Matter dated 17/8/22, a penalty of rupees 25 lakhs was imposed on your institution as one faculty namely Dr. Bhavana Anantrao Atram (AYKC02688), Associate Professor, (Agad Tantra) was proven to be physically not present but working only on paper teachers and same was communicated to you vide letter ref. no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2024 dated 10.08.2024.
- 4) Further, the assessment report of the academic year 2024-25 was placed in the 101st Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 06.08.2024 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria for issuance of permission, but fulfilling the criteria required for issuance of conditional permission as mentioned in Regulation 3(3) and as per the note mentioned in Schedule-IV, V and VI of MSR 2016. Hence, Board discussed and decided to issue 3rd Renewal of permission for the academic session 2024-25, after receiving the penalty. Thereafter, your institution has paid the penalty amount of Rs. 25 lakhs vide ref. no. SRKCAHRC/03955/2024 on dated 16.08.2024 through RTGS vide UTR no. UBINH24229417499 dated 16.08.2024.
- 5) Therefore, the 3rd Renewal of Permission is granted to Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan College of Ayurveda, Hospital & Research Centre, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, NH-12, Hoshangabad Road, Jathedi, Bhopal-26, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0628), with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, subject to condition that the college shall fulfill the following requirements:-
 - (i) The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - (ii) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
 - (iii) It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 6) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college

shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.

- Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and send a compliance report in order to be considered for the permission for the academic session 2025-26:
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 (1,2,3 and 4).
- 11. The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of 5th batch of students in the 1st professional BAMS is made under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
- The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time as per the norms which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
- 13. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
- 14. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
- 15. Please acknowledge the receipt of this letter.
