With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

I am directed to refer to your application vide dated 27.08.2020 forwarded by GOI vide letter No. L.14012/4/2020-EP (1) dated 17.09.2020 on the subject cited above and to say that to verify the physical and other infrastructure facilities available at proposed Ayurved College namely Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan College of Ayurveda, Hospital & Research Centre, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, NH-12, Hoshangabad Road, Jathedi, Bhopal-462026, Madhya Pradesh, the college has been visited on 14.09.2021 by the visitation team of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine.

- The visitation report and all other related papers were placed before the 1. President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM). President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on careful consideration of the Scheme in terms of the enforced regulation namely "the Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019 and provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made there under, has decided to approve the scheme.
- In view of above Letter of Intent (LOI) is issued to start New Ayurveda 2. College in the name of Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan College of Ayurveda, Hospital & Research Centre, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, NH-12, Hoshangabad Road, Jathedi, Bhopal-462026, Madhya Pradesh with 100

seats in UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2021-22, under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 subject to the condition that following conditions shall be fulfilled before the inspection of the CCIM for issuance of Letter of permission (LOP) for the academic session 2020-21, failing which the recommendation for issuing Letter of Permission (LoP) shall not be sent to the M/O AYUSH, Govt. of India and Letter of Intent (LOI) issued shall be deemed to be withdrawn.

i. The applicant shall fulfill all the requirements of infrastructure for teaching and training facilities as specified in "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurved Colleges and attached Hospitals)

Regulations, 2016";

ii. The applicant shall fulfill all the requirements of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations,

- iii. The applicant shall fulfill all the relevant provisions of Regulations namely the "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019"
- iv. The applicant shall fulfill all the relevant provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970.
- The applicant is also need to submit the requisite fixed security deposit as 6 (1) (i) of notified Regulations namely the 3. specified under the section "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019".
- The college administration is to ensure that no student is admitted in the UG (BAMS) course till the formal permission by issue of Letter of Permission (LOP) of the Central Government is granted.
- The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) will visit the college virtual or physical to verify the compliance of the fulfillment of 5. the above conditions by the applicant and recommendations for issuing/not issuing the LOP will be furnished to the Central Government.
- In the event, the applicant college fails to comply with or satisfy the conditions of the Letter of Intent; the Letter of Intent shall be deemed to have been withdrawn without further intimation to the applicant.

It is also certified that adequate clinical material as per the norms of the Central Council of Indian medicine is available with the proposed Medical College. It is further certified that in case the applicant fails to create infrastructure for the Ayurved college as per the Central Council of Indian medicine norms and fresh admissions are stopped by the Central Government, the State Government shall take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in the College with the permission of the Central Government.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government notified that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. In view of the above the Central Government constituted the Autonomous Boards with effect from 11th June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. I am directed to refer to your application vide dated 27.08.2020 forwarded by GOI vide letter No. L.14012/4/2020-EP (1) dated 17.09.2020, on the subject cited above and to say that to verify the physical and other infrastructure facilities available at proposed Ayurved College namely Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan College of Ayurveda, Hospital & Research Centre, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, NH-12, Hoshangabad Road, Jathedi, Bhopal-462026, Madhya Pradesh, (Inst. ID AYU0628) the college was visited on 14.09.2021 for LOI by the visitation team of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) and as per direction of competent authority Letter of Intent has been issued to you vide letter No. 3-5/2021-Ay(52) dated 07.10.2021 to establish a new Ayurveda college in the name of "Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan College of Ayurveda, Hospital & Research Centre, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, NH-12, Hoshangabad Road, Jathedi, Bhopal-462026, Madhya Pradesh, (Inst. ID AYU0628)" with 100 seats in UG (BAMS)course from the academic session 2021-22 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.

- 2. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) had carried out an inspection of the institution again on **23.11.2021** for Letter of Permission (LOP) and to assess the available facilities of teaching and practical training for conducting UG (BAMS) course and to verify the compliance of shortcomings informed by the NCISM under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
- 3. On examining the same it is found that the College is fulfilling the notified and approved criteria for Issuing Letter of Permission (LOP) for 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, for the Academic Session 2021-22 onward.
- 4. Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) to issue Letter of Permission (LOP) to the Registrar, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, NH-12, Hoshangabad Road, Misrod, Bhopal-462026, Madhya Pradesh to start a new Ayurveda Medical College in the name of Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan College of Ayurveda, Hospital & Research Centre, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, NH-12, Hoshangabad Road, Jathedi, Bhopal-462026, Madhya Pradesh with 100 seats in BAMS course under Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, subject to following conditions:-
- i. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month from the date of issue of the letter, explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying fee same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- ii. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 UG (BAMS) seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2021-22 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- 5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2021 to get permission for the session 2022-23:
 - (i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
- 8. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulations thereunder, are in position before the admission of the first batch of students in the 1st professional of BAMS course is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM.

- 9. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for II, III and IV professionals well in time as per the erstwhile CCIM norms which will be verified by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM and accordingly, the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be issued.
- 10. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first, batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
- 11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2022-23.
- 12. Further vide commission letter ref no. 3-5/2021-Ay(52) dated 05.01.2022 letter has been sent to the college to furnish fixed security deposit worth rupees 02 Crore in favour of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine, in response of the same college has furnished the fixed security deposit in favour of The National Commission fund for Indian System of Medicine through UTR No. UBINR22022010501205815, dated 05.01.2022 of 02 Crore transferred by branch Union Bank of India, R. K. D. F. College Branch, Bhopal, MP for a period of five years.
